


Once added to your screen, animations can also be formatted so they look exactly how you want them to.

To format an animation you need to use the options available in the Properties Panel.

Below are instructions on how to change the main formatting attributes.


Opacity: allows to set the transparency of the animation. By default this value is set to 100%.

Change the value in the box, then click on the **OK** button to save the change.


Rotation: allows to set a rotation angle for your animation. By default this value is set to 0.

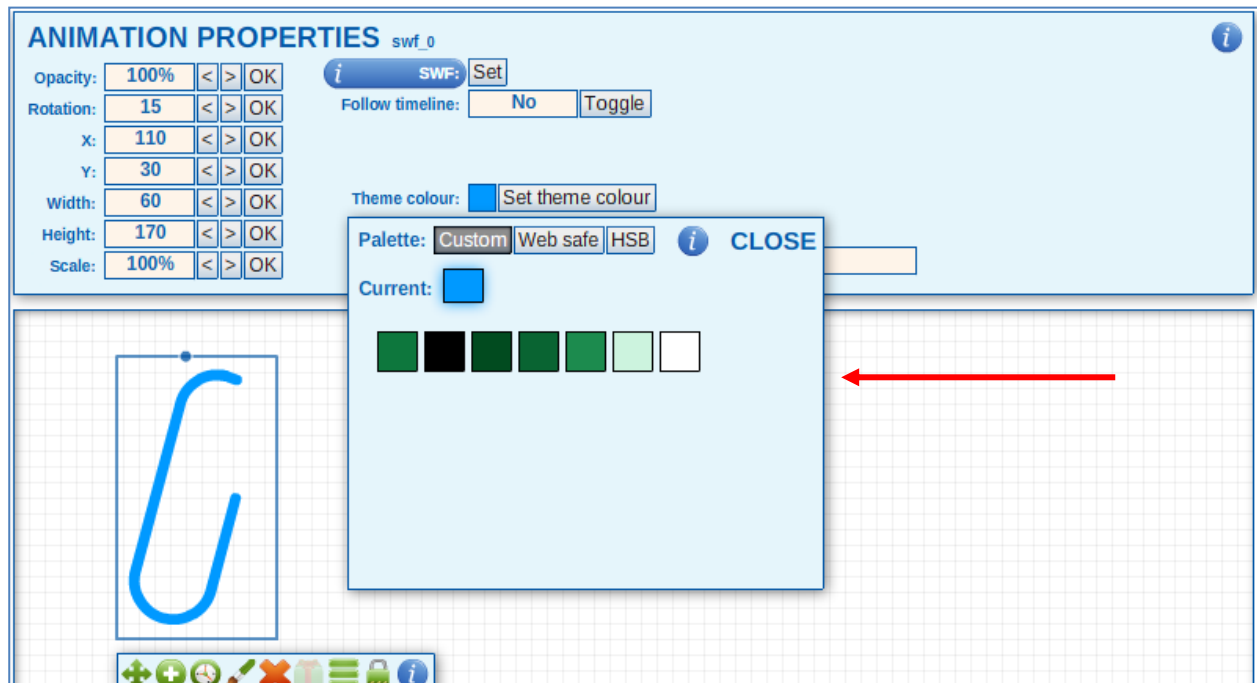
Change the value in the box, then click on the **OK** button to save the change.

Theme colour: allows to change the colour of the animation using one of 3 palettes:

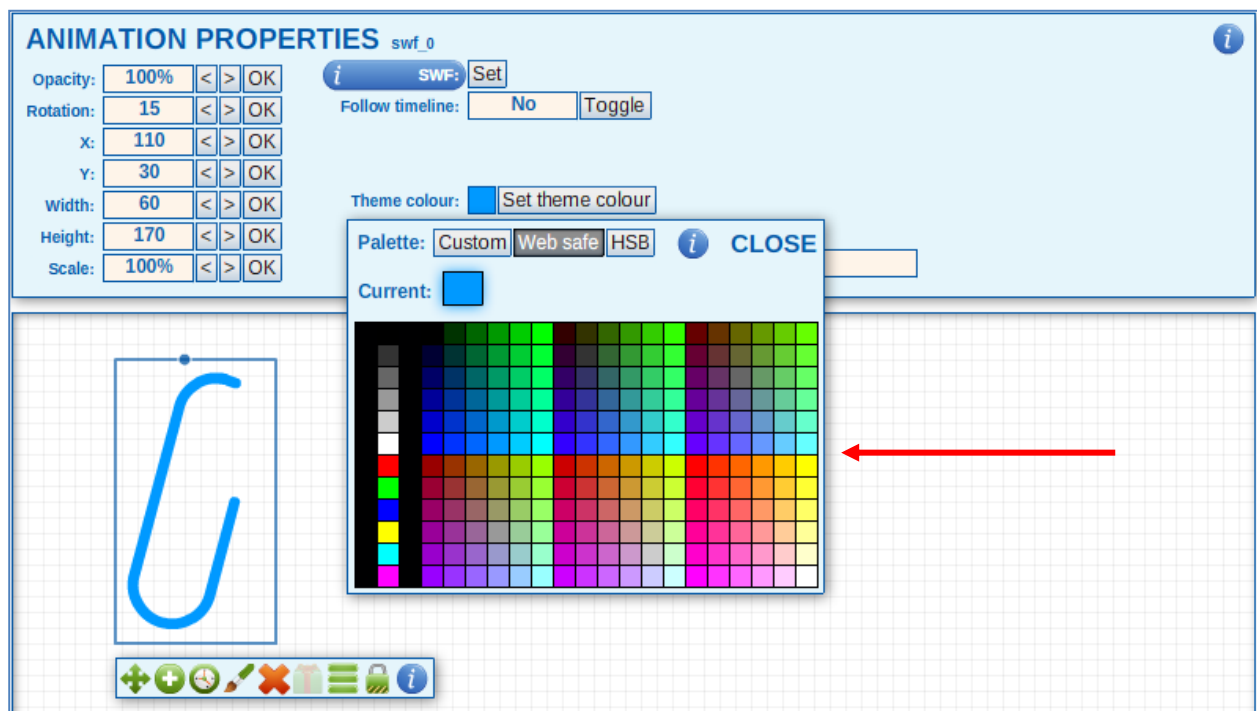

1) To select from the palette of colours defined in the project styles click on the **Set theme colour** button and select from the available colour options.

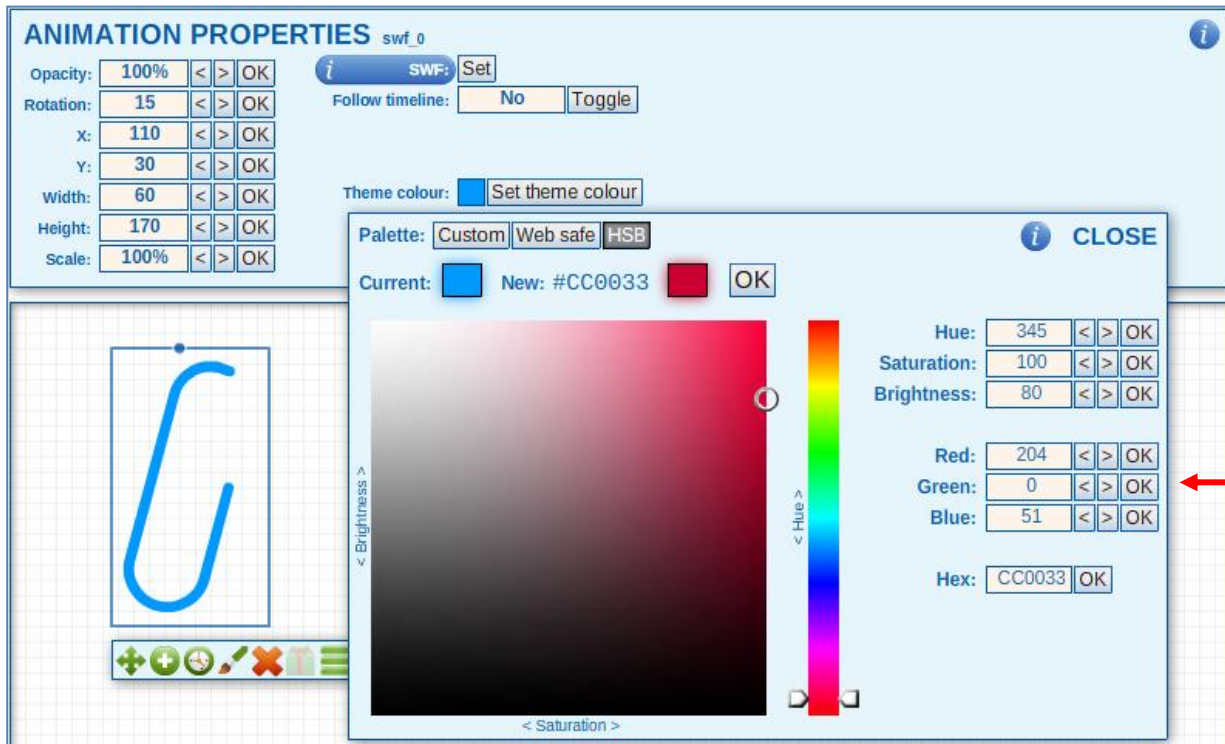


2) To apply a different colour from those defined in the project styles, select the **Web safe** button to access the selection below:



Click on the colour you want to apply, then click on the **OK** button to exit the palette and apply the change.

3) To apply a very specific shade of colour, click on the 'HSB' button to access the HSB Palette. This will allow you to select the exact colour you need using the RGB values, the HSB values or the HTML colour code/HEX number without creating a style in your project:



Type the values in the relevant boxes, making sure to click on the **OK** button next to each of the values, then click on the **OK** button at the top of the box.

Your marketing team should be able to give you details of the codes required for any corporate colours used within your organisation.
