

Increasing Attempts for Multiple Choice Questions

When you add a multiple choice question to your screen, by default the learners of your course will only be able to answer the question once.

However, the number of attempts that the learner can have to answer the question if they give the incorrect answer, can be increased, allowing your learners to try again as many times as the number of attempts you set.

Select the question object so that its properties are displayed in the **Properties** toolbar and then alter the number of **Allowed attempts** as desired.
